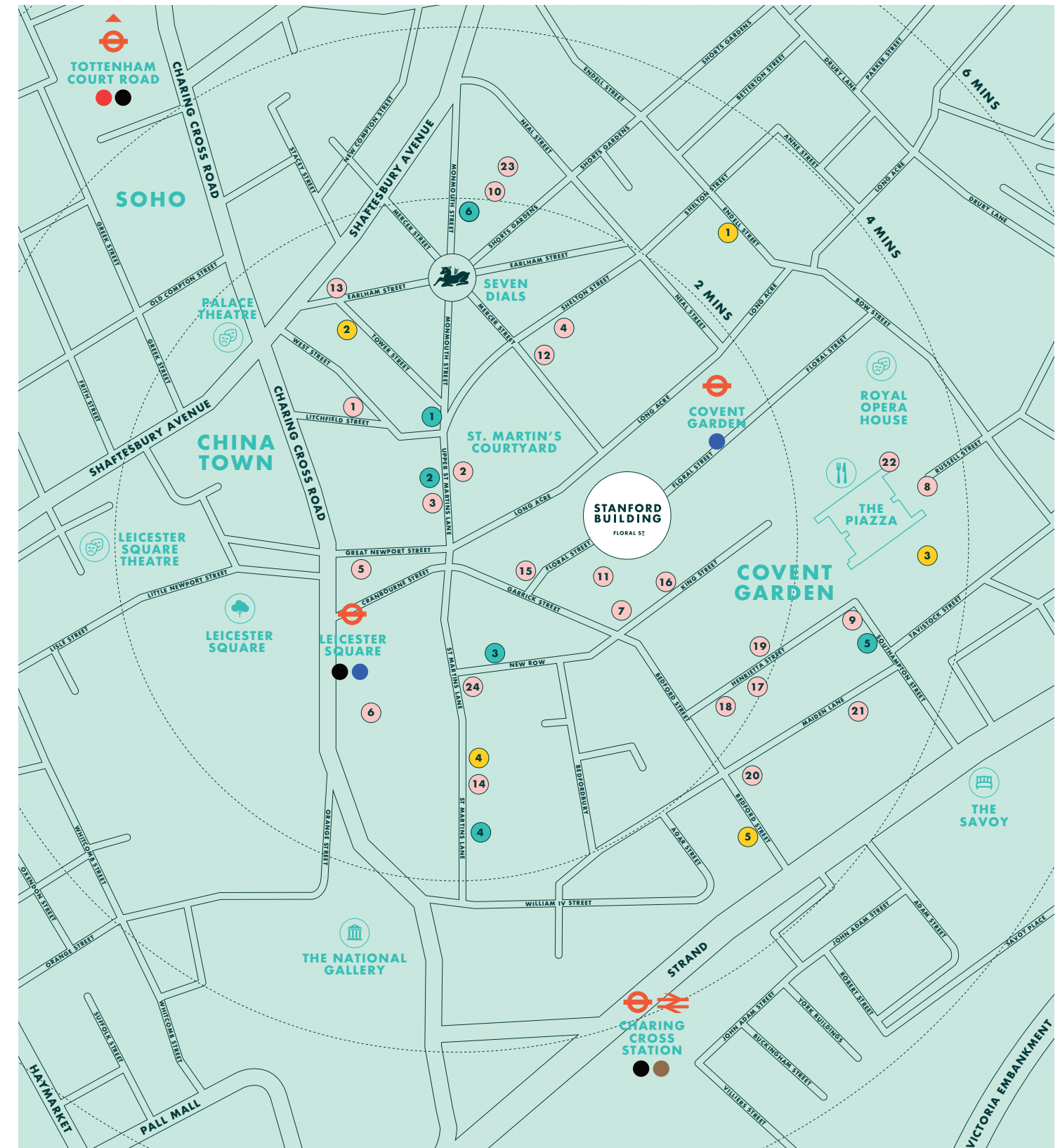

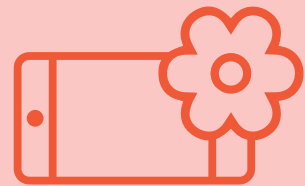
A colourful place to be based.

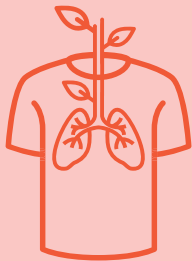

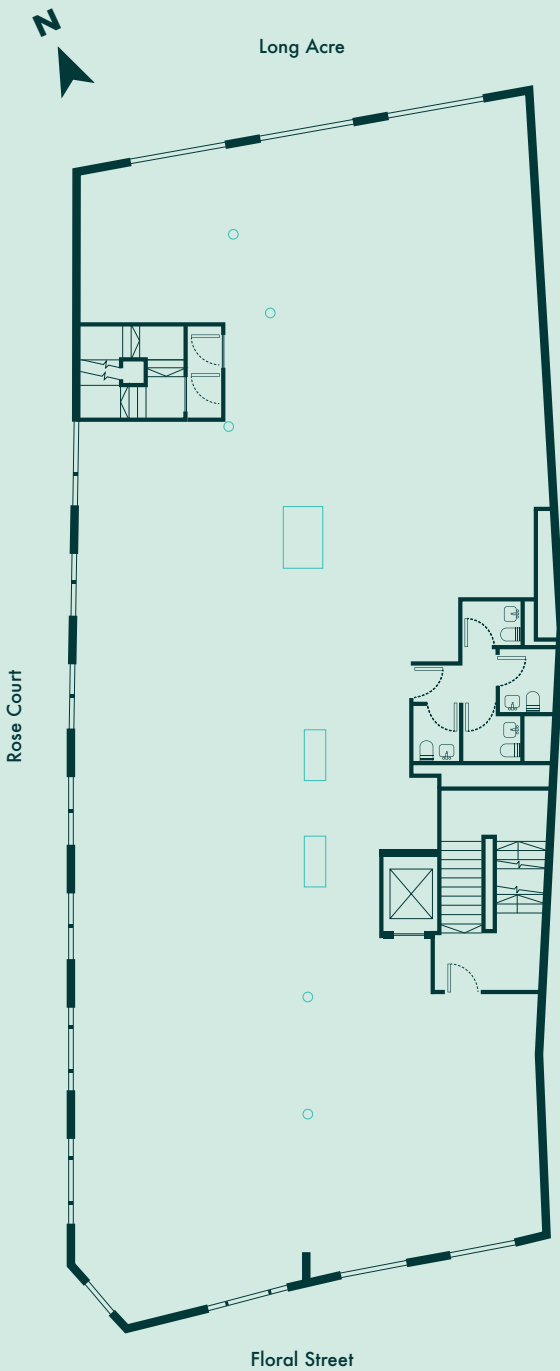

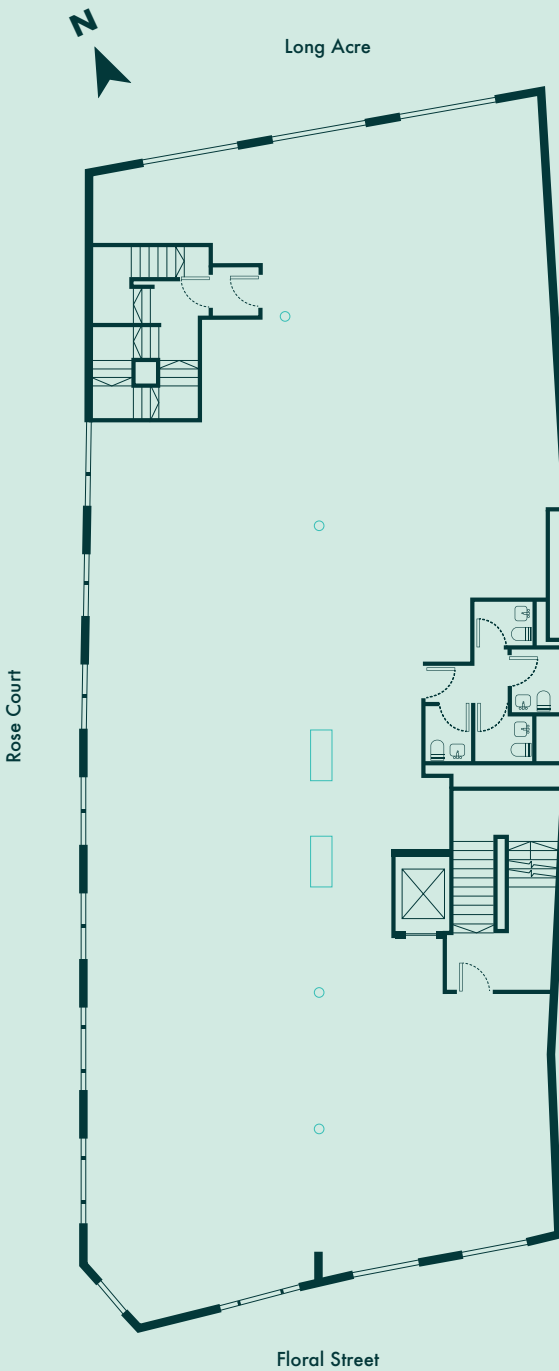

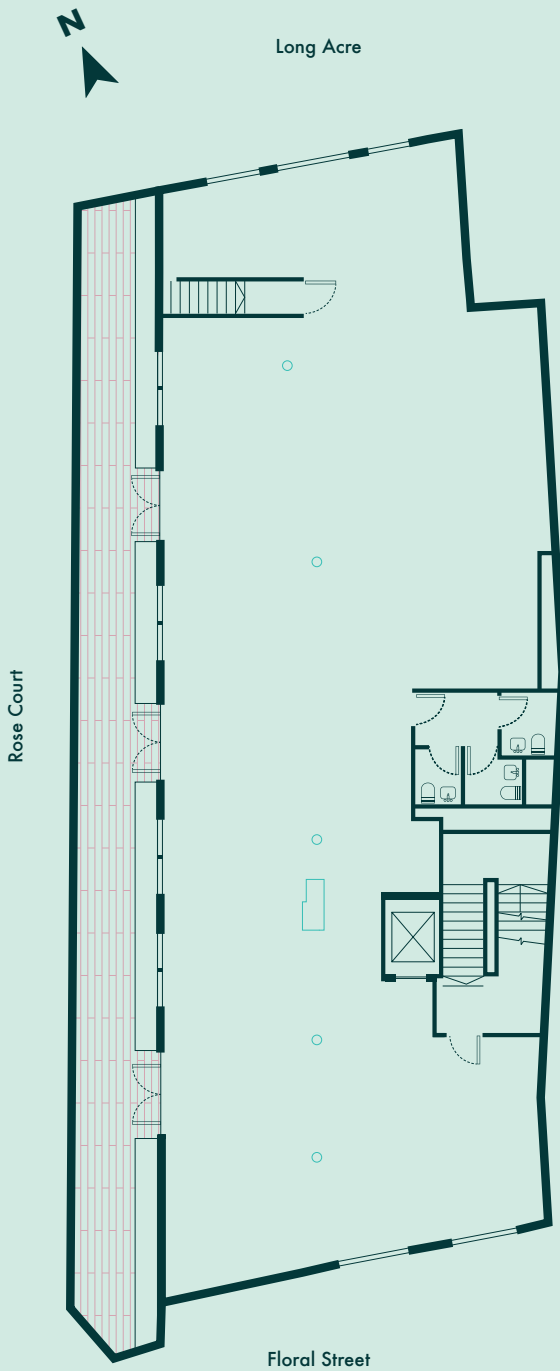
Second Floor
